THE SUMMER FUN HAS BEGUN!

BCH IS A KEY PLAYER FOR HILLSBOROUGH COUNTY SCHOOL RENOVATIONS



Public schools are not wasting time making good use of the Half Penny Promise. Mechanical improvements at 16 schools around the county are already underway and they are all a direct result of the half-penny sales tax increase taxpayers voted for last year. BCH Mechanical is leading the way on five (5) of the mechanical retrofits totaling over \$11 million dollars of work, completed in 9 weeks this summer.

BCH Mechanical's project list includes:

- Blake HS (EWI Construction)
- Alonso HS (The Beck Group)
- Durant HS (Creative Contractors)
- Dunbar Elementary (JE Dunn Construction)
- Sickles HS (Williams Company)

The key to success has been in the rigorous planning. For example on Blake HS, we had equipment being purchased nearly 4 months ago including: two (2) water cooled chillers, chilled water pumps, 22- new air handlers, 2 boilers and flue piping. In total there were 14 full semi-trucks of equipment and materials all timed like a rocket launch to arrive the first week that school was out.





Over 6 weeks, prior to arrival dates, the BCH and Trane teams made 2 or 3 phone calls per week to the scheduler at the plant who was tracking the production and conveying the expectations on the major equipment. Then there was over 4 weeks of communicating with the Traffic Department to understand how critical delivery was due to the crane requirements. Add to that, behind the scenes, one of the equipment trucks was involved in an accident in route. Due to all of the correspondence, the critical nature was already understood by the factory. The units damaged in the accident were returned to the factory, re-worked, and team drivers set up to deliver on Saturday, just in time for our major lift on Monday. WHEW!!!!

All of the equipment including twenty two (22) air handlers- that had to be craned into equipment rooms, was accomplished in two (2) days. BCH had pre-fabricated the CEP and major pieces of each equipment room, so over 60% of the field labor was already completed before we even set foot on the job. The planning, pre-fabrication effort and the fast start is critical to the success of these schools, which there is "no excuse" other than full operational cooling that first day of school in August.

These are the small first steps in a 10-year plan that will pour over \$1.3 billion back into Hillsborough County schools as a result of the Half Penny Promise. Of course, BCH wants to be recognized as the "go to contractor" when it comes to summer shut down schools and is leading the charge this summer.

PROJECT SPOTLIGHT



BCH Mechanical was hired for the new United States Automobile Association (USAA) Crosstown Center HQ and immediately began coordinating the project in virtual reality utilizing our 3-D software. Our team coordinated all aspects of the central plant and above ceiling scope for the HVAC and plumbing.

The Central Plant utilized 1300 tons of water cooled chillers, cooling towers and high efficiency pumping systems to distribute chilled water throughout the facility. The facilities were fed primarily by 16 fan array air handlers, 208 fan powered boxes via a medium pressure ductwork systems. The first 25' of ductwork was fabricated in 16 gauge sheet metal with 2" 3# density liner to soften any air noise throughout the system. The plumbing systems utilized electric water heaters, sensor activated water closets, and lavatories and premium fixtures. The project also included a full parking garage with floor drains throughout.

This project was recognized by Associated Builders and Contractors and won Best Mechanical for projects under 10 million. See page 5 for photos.

RECENT INITIATIVES FOR THE BCH AND CONSERV TEAM

Safety is BCH Mechanical and ConServ Building Services top priority! We encourage all employees to take 5 seconds and 5 steps back when approaching a situation where safety hazards are potential.

- 1. Do I understand task?
- 2. Do I have material and tools to fully complete task?
- 3. Is the work area safe, clean and secure?
- 4. Any hazards that need correction before I proceed?
- 5. Anything preventing me from completing task?
- 6. Are lock-out's/tag-out's required?
- 7. Is working area a confined space?8. Are there any fall protection risks?
- 9. Are there any cut risks?
- 10. Am I wearing the proper PPE for task?
- 11. Will I sign my name? Is my Quality Acceptable?

All of our employees are OSHA 10 or 30 Certified and every office completes safety audits. We are currently in the process of adding Smart Drive cameras to all work trucks and vans to eliminate at fault accidents, discourage incorrect driving habits, and provide positive coaching opportunities.

PROTECT YOURSELF FROM THE SUMMER SUN!

BCH/ConServ ensure that all employees are educated on preventing heat stress! Heat illness exposure can cause illness and death. There are precautions that can be taken any time temperatures are high and the job involves physical work.

Risk Factors for Heat Illness:

- High temperature and humidity, direct sun exposure, no breeze or wind
- Heavy physical labor
- No recent exposure to hot workplaces
- Low liquid intake
- Waterproof clothing

What are BCH/ConServ Doing to Prevent Heat Illness:

- We have established a complete heat illness prevention program.
- All employees are trained about the hazards leading to heat stress and how to prevent them.
- Every job site is provided with cool water close to the working area(s)
- Summer work schedules are arranged for frequent rest period in a shaded or airconditioned area
- Designated individuals are responsible for monitoring conditions and protecting workers who are at risk of heat stress.

CAPE CANAVERAL SKID CHILLER INSTALLATION

BCH Mechanical in conjunction with our Comfort Systems Operating Co. EAS installed a pre-fabricated chiller plant.

This project shows off the full talent of Comfort Systems companies working together to accomplish the goal of a full chiller plant installed and operational in less than a month.

EAS pre-fabricates the skids and BCH assembles it all in the field, typically in a fraction of the time, it takes a normal water cooled chilled water installations.
